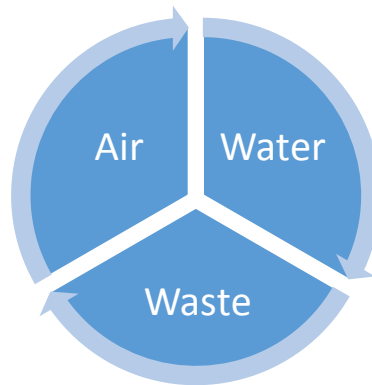

Testing and Inspections of New Requirements

Revision of the federal underground storage tank regulations will now require owners/operators to perform operational testing and maintenance of their equipment, and to conduct walk through inspections of the UST systems. Once the new testing and inspection services begin to be performed by many different service providers, review of the companies' results on forms of their choice or methods that were used may become difficult to interpret. In response to the need for a standardized way to perform testing, inspect, and maintaining UST systems, Petroleum Equipment Institute (PEI) formed two separate committees to create comprehensive guidance documents outlining methods and describing how this work should be done as well as providing forms to record the work performed. PEI/RP-900 (Recommended Practices for the Inspection and Maintenance of UST Systems) and PEI/RP-1200 (Recommended Practices for the Testing and Verification of Spill, Overfill, Leak Detection and Secondary Containment Equipment at UST Facilities), were completed and published in anticipation of the revision of the federal regulations. Each section of the documents will be reviewed and the audience will be invited to ask technical questions and discuss concerns that they may have when dealing with the new testing and inspections associated with the revised EPA UST regulations.

Joint Brownfields, CERCLA, Federal Facilities & Hazardous Waste Session: Optimization of Remedies

U.S. EPA will outline new ways of investigating sites using high resolution site characterization and data visualization tools to rapidly build the conceptual site model in an adaptive process. The presenters will explain goals to get a complete understanding, with a high level of confidence, the contamination problem set and the geology/hydrogeology in which that problem set resides; how to rapidly gather enough vital information at scales necessary to inform potential remedy choices, focusing on root causes; and how to minimize mobilizations and transaction costs. This presentation will briefly describe the approach and focus on recent site work at several sites of different scale to showcase the process and workflows that demonstrate its effectiveness. It will also touch on site-specific data management support.

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Materials Management: Waste Management Support Tools for Radiological and Other Incidents

The Radiological Incident Waste Estimation Tool (WEST) estimates the type and amount of waste generated from cleanup after a radiological incident. The Incident Waste Decision Support Tool (I-WASTE) was developed to assist decision makers at all levels to ensure rapid and effective management of disaster-generated waste while protecting public health and the environment.

U.S. EPA and Department of Defense (DoD) will each provide briefings on its emerging contaminants and chemical risk programs. DoD has a program to identify, assess risks, and develop risk management actions for Emerging Contaminants (ECs). The program employs a three-tiered process called "scan-watch-action." DoD's briefing will describe the assessment process, provide examples of on-going risk management actions, and discuss a set of "triggers" and corresponding actions in response to EC releases. The discussion on the EC triggers will also cover issues that have arisen between DoD and regulators. U.S. EPA's Office of Chemical Safety and Pollution Prevention (OCSPP) will provide a briefing on its TSCA Work Plan, part of EPA's chemical safety program. The Work Plan helps focus and direct the activities of its Existing Chemicals Program. EPA will also discuss its work with other government stakeholders and provide case studies on the development of risk reduction activities for several chemicals.
