## ***Executive Summary***

In addition to funding for environmental assessments and cleanups, EPA provides a variety of technical assistance opportunities to support the reuse of Brownfield sites. This document provides an overview of available technical assistance opportunities including a description of each opportunity, how to access/apply for the assistance, example deliverables, and contact information for additional information. The intended audience for this document includes State Brownfield Coordinators and staff.

This document is not exhaustive of all resources available; it reflects the programs that the ASTSWMO Brownfields Focus Group was aware of at the time of publication. The document also includes past programs that are not currently available in case these programs are reinstated in the future. This information was compiled during the first year of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, also known as the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL). To assist small communities, Indian tribes, rural areas, or disadvantaged areas

Brief Description:	<p>At \$20,000 per grant, Section 128(a) TAG must be used to assist small communities, Indian tribes, rural areas, or disadvantaged areas. The funds are to carry out activities outlined in CERCLA Section 104(k)(7), “to facilitate the inventory of brownfields sites, site assessments, remediation of brownfield sites, community involvement, or site preparation.” Examples include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Brownfields inventories,</li> <li>▪ Planning assistance,</li> <li>▪ Brownfields site concept plans,</li> <li>▪ Market and Feasibility Studies,</li> <li>▪ Community involvement plans,</li> <li>▪ Brownfields Workshops,</li> <li>▪ Structural Analyses, and</li> <li>▪ Flood Risk and Resiliency planning.</li> </ul> <p>Any 128(a) eligible applicant (States, Territories, and Tribes) may request a Section 128(a) TAG as part of the annual CERCLA 128(a) State and Tribal Response program funding cycle. Appendix A of the annual grant funding guidance provides the specific instructions for requesting 128(a) TAG funds in a given fiscal year.
